Maintenance

The maintenance team has been busy with grounds work in April. Aeration, fertilization, seeding, weeding, and mulching have been taking place across our parks and buildings. Irrigation was turned on and calibrated at all buildings. Testing and sprinkler repairs have been conducted. Ballfield season is picking up. Spring softball games are going on several times a week and practices daily at most locations. Spring soccer will be coming to an end in mid-May but kept us occupied throughout April.

Several adjustments have been made in our work order software (Helix). These changes will more efficiently send notifications to the appropriate party (marketing or maintenance) by setting up "auto flow" routes of specific work requests. We have learned that Helix no longer offers a field

inventory service where they will physically come to your business and inventory all your major assets. This will have to be done in-house incrementally. Helix will help us log everything into the software.

We attended the CPRA Spring Parks Tradeshow! This provides great networking opportunities with other parks professionals and potential vendors. We took several classes while there. The subjects included: irrigation troubleshooting, 2-wirgation systems, planning sustainable landscaping developments, natural play structures, and benefits of using native plant landscaping.

accommodate the growing program.

Overall, it was a great experience to go through lots of positive feedback and conversation between Carbon Valley and StarGuard. April group and private lessons continued to see growth from previous months. The pool was the place to be during the most recent Kids Nite Out at the Rec. Out of the 127 Private Swimming Lessons time slots offered, 86 were filled with 75 of them being unique students.
